FATHER HANSEN'S CORNER

A year or two ago, one Sunday, after the 10:45am Mass as I recall, I was enjoying the life of the parish—the good number of families and faithful, both young and old. It has been said to me, including by Bishop Johnston, that we have such a diverse parish with so many children. Anyway, that Sunday I was seemingly reveling in this, and a parishioner stopped me in the vestibule, paused, and said “it’s not you, it’s your mother.” Three years ago today my mother passed away. I think the parishioner was correct in giving credit to her, my mom, who died fortified by the Sacrament of the Church. She loved visiting the parishes I served (especially after my dad’s death). I remember when my mom died a brother priest sent me this message: “As St. Josemaria would often say: The Lord calls people out of this transient life at the best possible time. Now we have a special intercessor. Like the Mother of God, the mother of a priest will be a very special assistant to her son with her prayers before Our Lady and her Divine Son.”

I think of something my mom did daily which surely played a role in her helping me on earth and we pray from heaven; she prayed the Rosary. Last week at one of the Masses I got particularly excited again with the faithful attendance at Mass through Christmas and the good crowds. But, what if we were all praying the daily rosary I asked myself. Here in the month of January, let us all consider praying at least one decade of the Rosary every day. Our Mother, Mary, will help us even more than she is. She’s given fifteen promises for those who pray the Rosary. With one decade in January, let’s get to two decades daily in February. By May, the 5th month of the year and the month of Mary, the month we’ll no doubt be back in our church, we’ll have all five decades down. Sometimes, maybe once a week, we could pray the Rosary in our homes with family. If we’re single, maybe commit to one day a week at the parish with others. But other days maybe we’ll pray a couple decades before work or school, one decade on our lunch hour, and maybe two decades on the way home (before we listen to Catholic Radio or sports news).

With this, we’ll all be able to tell people who visit our parish in the years to come, seeing the beautiful church, the works of Charity, and hours of Adoration, “it’s not us, it’s our mother!”

These are just a few of the many services places such as Rosebrooks, Safehouse, Newhouse, Hope House, Domestic Violence Ctr., Joyce Williams Shelter and more within the Kansas City area provide. Each year the Diocesan Council of Catholic Women (DCCW) show their support of these organizations through the collection of personal hygiene items that are provided to the individuals when they arrive at the home or shelter. Since most leave in an emergency situation, they arrive only with what they have on. The centers provide them with the personal items they will need during their stay. Here is where we can help. **Instead of shoe boxes, we will be using gallon size zip lock bags to package the following items: Soap (bar), Deodorant, Shampoo-Conditioner, Wash Cloth, Toothbrush and Toothpaste.** Items are needed for women and men.

A&R will have a table set up this weekend where you can see how the finished bags will look or pick up a bag to fill. **A labeled bin will be located in the back of the Parish Hall where items can be dropped off. All bags should be returned to Coronation by Sunday, March 4.** Items will be delivered on March 7 to the DCCW meeting by Renee Jordan and Carolyn Cullum, where representatives from the centers will pick them up. 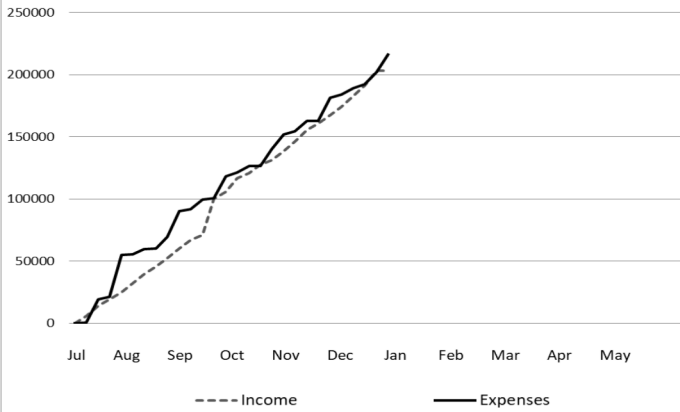

The Junior Legion of Mary is an organization for the spiritual development of persons under 18 years of age. Universities and Seminaries have groups, too, for the college age students. These are considered Senior Legion of Mary adult groups. All Legion of Mary groups, both Senior and Junior, are all run basically the same, with the exception of the works, which are maturity- and age-appropriate. Each group which is called a praesidium, is run under the guidance of a spiritual director, who is usually a priest or deacon, or in some cases a religious (consecrated) Brother or Sister.

What Benefits Can the Junior Legion of Mary Bring?

TO OUR PARISH: It forms a spiritual army of youth within any parish. Many worthwhile tasks are performed, which would otherwise be neglected. As a consequence, more blessings are earned, more graces are gained, and more souls are saved.

TO OUR YOUTH: A unique opportunity for spiritual growth is given. No other organization offers a daily program of prayer, a weekly work assignment and the discipline of a meeting each week. In crucial years when formation is so essential, the Junior Legion develops confidence and spiritual and mental growth of the personality. Junior Legionaries stand to gain for everything they freely give in service to Mary.

TO OUR CHURCH: Lay Apostles are wanted and needed. A firm spiritual foundation given to our youth will insure a source of supply of Lay Apostles for years to come. As Junior Legionnaires, our youth are taught to give to their Church as productive members, rather than to wait for what they can receive. The Junior Legion forms good Catholics now, and better Catholics tomorrow.

After offering this idea up in prayer, Fr. Hansen has chosen to have the youth decide on the name of their Praesidium at their first meeting. Mary has many names to choose from so do your homework. **Youth ages 13-18 are invited to attend.** Deacon Mike will be the spiritual leader for this organization. Parish Memorials

Capital Improvement Fund

This fund is specific and is dedicated to the improvement, not the maintenance of the parish property and facilities. It is within the scope of this fund to assist in, not fund, the replacement of roofs, windows, carpeting, heating, plants, office equipment, etc.

Renovation Fund

This fund is specific in vision and long term. The celebration of the liturgy is the primary reason for the existence of a parish and occasionally the parish structures may be in need of a cosmetic renewal. Additions to either fund can be made in the forms of stock, cash or bequests in memory of family members or friends. Monies designated for this purpose cannot be used for capital improvements or for other obligations.
